Resources Distributed – March 2017

Over \$4.9 million was distributed by Habitat Minnesota in FY 16

As a State Support Organization, Habitat for Humanity of Minnesota works to meet the needs of all Habitat affiliates around the state. We serve as a statewide resource development and support organization that serves, advocates for, and advances the work of Minnesota’s affiliates. Resource development began as the provision of loan and grant funds to affiliates but has grown to include a variety of services and resources to advance the affiliates in every facet possible.

Habitat Minnesota’s new Strategic Plan aims to improve Habitat for Humanity across the state by including strategies to:

- Develop new loan and/or grant funds
- Enhance strategic partnerships with organizations to serve more Habitat homeowners
- Support and enrich the leadership and technical capability of Habitat Minnesota staff
- Grow the Sustainable Building Program to further enhance our affiliates’ impact on Habitat homeowners
- Enhance and maintain a strategic communications, events and fund development plan
- Seek opportunities to develop a statewide preferred vendor and/or bulk purchasing program

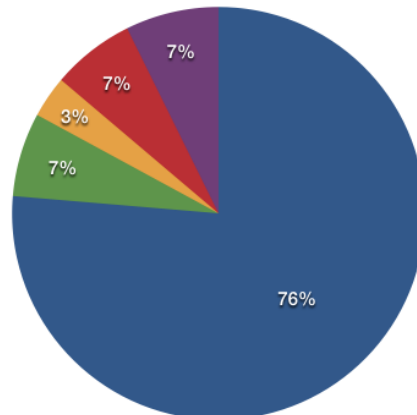
More than **150 visits** were made to affiliates by Habitat Minnesota staff
